On the first day, the students were taken on a school tour, which included a visit to their rich museum, the Polo ground, Golf Course etc. This was followed by a talk on the history of Mayo College, and an activity of Treasure Hunt which further enabled the students to explore the campus. The competitions began on 21 October with Declamation and Reading. The Poetry recitation and French song competition took place the same evening in the beautiful and well decorated amphitheater. The Chief Guest at the occasion was the Ambassador of France in India, Monsieur Alexandre Ziegler. Among the dignitaries present, were a reporter and a photographer of the French magazine 'Figaro'. The auditorium was packed to capacity with students of both Mayo College for boys and Mayo Girls School, along with a visiting German delegation.

Our students, Eara Sharma presented a song and Nikita Jain recited poetry which made their presence felt with their spell-bounding performances, though they did not manage to bag a prize. The following day, the competitions of Quiz and Spell-bee were held.

In the evening, there was Mayo Film Festival, which showcased films made by participant schools as a part of movie-making contest. It was followed by a grand Closing Ceremony, wherein, Monsieur Olivier, reporter of Figaro magazine was the Chief Guest. There were performances by Mayo students. The judges and visiting teachers were felicitated.

The winning students were presented with trophies hand-crafted by Mayo students.

There was an official dinner hosted by the Director of Mayo College, Lt Gen Surendra Kulkarni at his residence on the same evening. In all, seven schools participated.

NEWCASTLE UNIVERSITY VISIT

Newcastle University visited our school on 22 October 2018. Dr Gary Ushaw, Senior Lecturer and Director of Business and Engagement of Newcastle University, conducted a Masterclass on Gaming and its social significance. The session was attended by students of Grades XI-XII (science stream). Dr. Ushaw talked about using Gaming technology to design games that can be used in the social service sector especially in the field of geriatrics and child learning.

It proved to be an extremely informative and engaging session for all asDr. Ushaw spent time answering their many personal queries on computer science as a career option.

SAMBA, SALSA AND SOUL: AFRICAN ROOTS IN MODERN MUSIC

A three day music workshop was conducted by The Australian Institute of Music Facilitator, Chris Fields, on 23-25 October 2018. The students who attended the event were Divyakshi Chandran of VIII D and Dhruv of XI C. The event was held at Sanskriti School, New Delhi.

The participants were given an introduction to the history of Cuban and Brazilian music, the musical terms/ traditional instrument related to Cuban music were discussed and demonstrated with students' participation. The children heard a song by a popular Cuban artist and started preparation, under the guidance of the facilitator, on La Malanga, a Cuban piece arranged by the facilitator himself.

Mr. Chris Fields demonstrated different rhythms on the drums and traditional Brazilian instruments like the Agogo. The focus was on the poly rhythmic components that formed this style of music and also the difference between the Cuban and Brazilian form. On the final day, the musical pieces were performed in the auditorium for the Sanskriti Principal, Teachers and students.

THIRD INTRA-SCHOOL SUNCITY MODEL UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE

Students of Grades X-XI organised the Third Intra-school Suncity Model United Nations Conference on the 27- 28 October 2018. Three committees were simulated for the event, namely, UNGA1- Disarmament and International Security; the Security Council and the All India Political parties meet. Students of Grades VII-XI participated in this two-day event. They discussed and debated real world issues like the Kashmir problem; Roadmap to general elections 2018 and territorial disputes. The delegates impressed the executive board members with the quality of their research and debate.

The unique point of this event was that this was a completely student-led initiative. From designing posters and placards to curating committees and agendas to preparing background guides and training the first time delegates; to deciding the food menu and drawing up the budget and seating plans, the organizing committee of the conference did everything.






VEGA INTER-SCHOOL CONCLAVE







