

NATURALISTIC EVENT- 'RUMBLE IN THE JUNGLE'

To enhance the logical, creative, naturalistic, and visual-spatial skills of the children, the Elementary Years Programme organised an Inter-Class Naturalistic Event, 'Rumble in the Jungle', for the students of kindergarten. The event was held on 27 July 2022. Keeping the theme of the year 'स्वदेशानुराग' in mind, the participants created a 2D habitat for an endangered animal. The children used natural materials such as twigs, corn-cob peel, dried flowers, dry leaves, pebbles, stones, ice-cream sticks, wool, cotton, and pencil shavings. They made animals with the paper folding technique. They assembled and pasted the material using fevicol, glue stick, double-sided tape, and glue drops, to create the habitat.

All the children presented a beautiful piece of artwork. They all were given tokens of appreciation.

WORLD BIOFUEL DAY- GRADES I AND II

World Biofuel Day was celebrated on 10 August 2022 by the students of Grades I and II. The importance of biofuels, which are produced from animal waste, algae and industrial and agricultural waste, was highlighted. The students were educated about Sustainable Development Goal 7, which ensures access to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy for all.

The session commenced with students doing a small activity in the classroom where they were asked to switch off all the power points that were not in use as an initiative to save energy.

Another activity was carried out to teach children about the 3Rs for sustainable development (reduce, reuse, and recycle) and waste management. Two bins, labelled as biodegradable and non-biodegradable, were placed in the corridors, and children were taught to segregate and throw the biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste in separate bins.

The lesson was concluded with a poster-making activity in which the students illustrated and drew their creative suggestions for using renewable energy. They discussed ways to use hydroelectric power, solar power, solar cookers, and battery-powered vehicles to reduce air pollution. It was a fantastic learning opportunity.



VISUAL-SPATIAL EVENT-EYP

To enhance the creativity, expression and fine motor skills of the children, the Elementary Years Programme organized a Visual-Spatial Event, 'Dip-Dab-Drizzle' for the students of Pre-nursery. The Intra and Inter-Class event was held on 27 July 2022.

The participants were given an outlined sketch of a tree and a peacock on an A3 sheet. They used different techniques like ear bud printing, sponge dabbing, finger printing and cotton dabbing, using a peg, to create the Indian flag on the feathers of the peacock. They also pasted the body of the peacock and 'Ashoka Chakra' using double-sided tape. They created a beautiful piece of art depicting their love for the nation keeping in mind the theme of the year 'Swadeshanurag'.



LOGICAL EVENT- 'SCULPT THE MASTERPIECE'

To enhance the fine motor skills, creativity, expressions and logical skills, the Elementary Years Programme organized an Intra and Inter-Class Logical Event, 'Sculpt the Masterpiece', on 27 July 2022, for Nursery children.




23rd August 2022

It was a very fruitful and enlightening trip that set many young minds aspiring to take up astronomy and learn more about the intriguing outer space.




GRADE III AND IV



It was integrated with **SDG-14: Life below water**. Everyone enjoyed and were captivated by the performances presented by our little artists on Science and Performing Arts.







3-D models. Students of grade IV researched and discussed about different characteristic features of edible aquatic plants and their plant parts. They creatively depicted the information on their scrap book.






GRADE V AND VI



GRADES VII-XII






