#### JAPAN ART MILE MURAL EXCHANGE 2023-24

Suncity School collaborated with Ashiya International Secondary School, Japan, to share knowledge and solutions to problems related to SDG 2, 3, 5,12 in the Japan Art Mile Mural Exchange Project. Students of International Academia and CBSE (MYP) began the exchange with a showcase of each other's culture. Important issues like food wastage, gender discrimination in food consumption, commonalities in food of the two countries were shared and discussed, culminating in the expression of a beautiful mural painting. The mural fostered intercultural communication, understanding and friendship. It inspired our students to embrace diversity, celebrate cultural differences and opened their eyes to the larger world view on the SDGs.

Together the two partner schools sent the following message to the world:

Eat local, grow local. Do not waste food. Food should have no gender preference. We are all human beings, and everyone needs to eat healthy to live healthy.

As more students engage in this project each year, they develop critical, creative thinking and problem-solving skills, while translating solutions into meaningful visual expressions. This 'beyond the classroom' initiative opens a wider, larger canvas of expression for our students, helping them develop their nonverbal language of communication.

The students of Grade VI showcased the concepts they had learned, explored and accomplished by putting together an exciting presentation during the Parent Walk-In with immense enthusiasm, creativity and dedication on the 9<sup>th</sup> of February. With the aim to convey a symbolic message and throw light on the 11th SDG goal, i.e. Sustainable Cities and Communities, students brainstormed about steps, however small, that they need to take to work towards creating a sustainable green home, school, neighbourhood, and society. Students discussed affordable, scalable solutions to enable countries to leapfrog to cleaner environment.

#### EXPLORING SUSTAINABLE SOLUTIONS: A VISIT TO TERI GRAM

On the bright Friday morning of 9th February 2024, Grade VII students embarked on an enlightening journey to TERI Gram, Gurugram, a beacon of sustainability nestled amidst the verdant landscapes. The excursion was a kaleidoscope of experiential learning, where the students delved into the realms of eco-friendly practices and technological innovations aimed at nurturing our planet.

The first stop of the excursion unveiled the marvels of vermi-composting, where students witnessed the transformation of organic waste into nutrient-rich compost by industrious earthworms. Next, the students were captivated by the intricacies of biomass gasification, where organic matter is converted into clean energy. A tour of the water treatment plant elucidated the vital role of purification processes in safeguarding our precious water resources. Amidst the lush greenery, the students were introduced to a myriad of medicinal plants, each with its unique healing properties. Through engaging narratives, the uses and significance of these plants were elucidated, fostering a deeper appreciation for traditional herbal remedies.

The pièce de résistance of the visit was the revelation of earth air tunnels, a marvel of sustainable architecture. Students marvelled at how natural processes were harnessed to regulate the temperature within the building, minimizing energy consumption and mitigating carbon emissions.

In conclusion, the visit to TERI Gram was a transformative experience that broadened the horizons of Grade VII students, instilling in them a profound understanding of sustainable living practices. As they bid farewell to this sanctuary of eco-consciousness, they carried with them a newfound zeal to champion environmental stewardship in their communities.











#### LEPROSY AWARENESS PROGRAMME-A SEWA INITIATIVE

Students of Grades VII- IX witnessed an enriching session on Leprosy on 10<sup>th</sup> February 2024. The session was led by Ms. Sophy and Mr. Subhojit Goswami from The Leprosy Trust Mission India, New Delhi. The objective of this session was to raise awareness about leprosy, educate on how to interact with patients and emphasize the importance of providing care and empathy.

The speakers discussed the transmission of leprosy and highlighted the demographics most affected within society. Despite the World Health Organization's provision of free treatment, many affected individuals either do not complete their treatment or do not receive it at all. The persistent societal stigma surrounding leprosy often prevents individuals from seeking help upon experiencing initial symptoms, resulting in delayed diagnosis and the development of disabilities.

Overall, the session was highly informative and impactful.





#### ORIENTATION PROGRAMME ELEMENTARY YEARS PROGRAMME

An **Orientation Programme** for new parents was organised on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2024. It emphasized the role of curiosity, experiential learning, and skill-based learning in education. Headmistress of the Elementary Years Programme, Ms. Sangeeta Bagchi addressed the gathering.

During her address to the parents, Ms. Bagchi began the session with an interesting activity which aroused the curiosity of the audience. The programme emphasized the importance of parenting for a child's overall development and compassion, understanding the importance of 'Trinity Triangle'. It also gave parents an insight into the integration of different disciplines with **multiple intelligences**, **design thinking (VUCA) and the Sustainable Development Goals**. Through examples, Ms Bagchi also explained the importance of stimulating interest among young minds.

Thereafter, the gathering was addressed by our passionate Director, Ms. Rupa Chakravarty. She addressed the gathering by talking about 'sanskars' and values. She talked about the pedagogy followed at Suncity school and also shared about the achievements of our young learners and authors.

This was followed by a mesmerizing performance by the students of Kindergarten C. The children showcased their class assembly based on a famous book, 'The Gruffalo'. It was followed by a captivating danceperformance. The programme in the auditorium culminated with the rendition of the National Anthem.
