

REPORT ON VIDEO CONFERENCE ON FESTIVALS WITH PREPATEC CAMPUS CIUDAD DE MÉXICO (MEXICO)

Our Video Conference with PrepaTec Campus Ciudad de México (Mexico)

was one of the most enriching experiences this academic session and a truly global experience wherein we had the Facilitator from Italy, Mr. Christopher Muscat, schools from Mexico and India and Generation Global –the Educational wing of the Tony Blair Faith Foundation, UK. The Conference was held on 9 October 2020 on the module-Festivals.

DISCUSSION PROGRESSION:

All of us belong to communities that mark special days or periods in our calendars.

Some of these events are joyous, while others serve a particular purpose or are a time of more solemn remembrance. Some of these festivals or holidays may be global, or national, they may have their origins in a religious or ancient tradition. But there will be variations in how these occasions are marked and these days will mean different things to different people. The aim of this dialogue was for students to explore the place of festivals and holidays in their lives and how these impact on them and their values and beliefs.

Sharing: Students shared with one another, the festivals or holidays that they thought were most important for them and for their communities.

Enquiring: Students asked questions of one another, focused on learning more about one another's festivals and special days.


This was to support students in developing threads so that they can use their dialogue skills to delve deeper into the main themes that emerge at this stage of the dialogue.

Challenge: Students thought of some lines of enquiry around the more challenging features and aspects of festivals: are any of these festivals or special days changing their meaning due to the forces of globalisation? Are there any people in your community who feel excluded from these occasions? They posed their own challenging questions!

Reflection: A couple of students from each class were called upon to summarize key learning points and to comment on the dialogue skills of their own class and of students in their partner class. It was also encouraged that students comment on they FEEL about the dialogue experience.











































LIVE SESSION TRAINING ON MICROSOFT TEAMS FOR STUDENTS OF GRADE VIII AND IX

VIDEO CONFERENCE WITH PREPA TEC CAMPUS CIUDAD DE MEXICO ON POWER OF NARRATIVE

Ten students from Grades VIII-IX participated in an engaging video conference with PrepaTec Campus Ciudad de México (Mexico), as a part of the Generation Global Initiative under the Tony Blair Faith Foundation, on 19 October 2020 on the module-Power of narrative.

VC CONTENT:

Narratives move and influence us: shaping our sense of self and our communities, whether these are urban legends, folklore, religious stories, political discourse or what we see and hear online. Stories are used to influence how we think and how we feel. In this dialogue, students had the opportunity to share the stories that shaped their lives and values, where they had seen narratives being used to influence for good and ill and how they themselves used storytelling as a tool.

Sharing: Students shared with one another a story or narrative that has impacted on them personally. **Enquiring:** Students asked questions of one another focused on what they had heard in the sharing session as well as to explore the power of narratives in their communities.

Challenge: The students enquired around the more challenging aspects of the rights of the power of narratives: Does it matter if a narrative is real? How should we respond to the global phenomena of 'fake news'?


Reflection: A couple of students from each school were called upon to summarise key learning points and to comment on the dialogue skills of their own class and of students in their partner class.



VIDEO CONFERENCE WITH FARRAGUT CAREER ACADEMY, CHICAGO, USA ON THE MODULE-WEALTH, POVERTY, INEQUALITY AND CHARITY

A Video Conference was held with Farragut Academy students (Chicago, USA) on 23 October 2020 as a part of the Generation Global Initiative-the educational wing of the Tony Blair Faith Foundation.

DISCUSSION PROGRESSION:

We can be wealthy or poor in many different ways: materially, emotionally, socially, spiritually. In this conference, students entered into dialogue about the ways in which they experienced wealth, poverty, inequality and charity and about some of the questions that these experiences raised for them and their communities.

Sharing: Students shared when and how they felt most wealthy and most poor.

Enquiring: Students asked questions of one another focused on what they had heard in the sharing session as well as asked questions to deepen their relative experiences of wealth, poverty and charity.

Challenge: Students further discussed on some lines of enquiry around the more challenging aspects of this topic such as, are there tensions between material and spiritual wealth or can both be held together? Are all acts of charity motivated by noble intentions?































INTER SCHOOL EVENT - COMMFLUENCE






